




Video Gambling Tax Collections

Video Gambling Machine tax collections for the second quarter of fiscal year 2011 (October, November and December) were approximately \$12.14 million, a decrease of \$200,000 from the previous quarter, and \$295,000 lower than the second quarter of fiscal year 2010.



Liquor and Gambling Licenses


In the second quarter of fiscal year 2011, the Division received 61 liquor, gambling and combined liquor gambling applications (including amended applications). This is only four less than the 65 applications received during the second quarter of last fiscal year.



Video Gambling Machine Permits

An individual video gambling machine permit fee is \$220 for the full fiscal year and is reduced by a prorated amount each subsequent quarter of the fiscal year. A portion of the fee (45%) goes to the local government where the machine is located and the balance goes to the Gambling Special Revenue Fund.

During the second quarter of fiscal year 2011, 434 video gambling machines received permits, approximately half of the number of permits issued in the second quarter of fiscal year 2010.



Card Games and Bingo

- By the end of second quarter, the number of card tables licensed during fiscal year 2011 was 319. This is down 68 tables from the same time last year.
- The number of card dealers licensed at the end of second quarter 2011 was 614, down 167 from the same time last year.
- The total number of bingo and keno licenses increased to 80 in the second quarter of fiscal year 2011, an increase of 12 over the second quarter of fiscal year 2010.

Video Gambling Machines Reporting Online

Currently 99% of all video gambling machines are reporting through an approved automated accounting system.
