





Accomplishments and Efficiencies

- Formally joined remaining High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) task forces
- Southwest Drug Task Force (Butte) led multi-state/international drug case on Mexican Cartel
- DIO has 97 agencies inputting overdose data into system (includes public health)
- ICAC made 58 arrests in 2022 and jointly participated in undercover investigations with partner agencies that identified additional suspects.

- Child & Family Ombudsman reviewed DPHHS cases involving 225 children.
- SAKI developed 26 online modules on sexual assault investigations. All POST certified.
- Crime Victims Compensation paid out over \$1.7 million to Montana crime victims in '21 and'22
- \$5.6 million in federal funding through programs or grants. (ICAC, Medicaid Fraud, Crime Victim)

Future Goals & Plans

- Year-around law enforcement academy services (from 3 Basic classes to 4)
- Permit community colleges and university system to train police officers
- Expand Human Trafficking investigations.
- Increase Major Crime Investigations staff to support local law enforcement due to rise in violent crime.
- Additional Narcotics Agents to help with drug problem
- Interconnectivity with Courts for disposition information with Criminal Records and Identification Services Section.



- Establish a DCI Sexual Assault Response Network program to increase survivor access to forensic medical exams
 - Initiate development of Tele-SANE
- Add staff to ICAC & Computer Crime Unit due to flood of child porn and exploitation
- Increase in ICAC and SVOR joint operations statewide.
- Sustain and expand Elder Justice project through permanent funding to continue supporting local investigations and prosecutions of elder abuse.







This request of \$50,000 per year will be used to address the influx of methamphetamine and opioids such as heroin and fentanyl into the state of Montana. The Narcotics Bureau's goal is to target major Drug Trafficking Organizations (DTO's) who are distributing dangerous drugs. Undercover operations must match the volume and pace of the traffickers and these aditional resources are needed to keep pace.




Montana Human Trafficking Cases 2014 - Present

NP - 502 - Major Case Investigators -

This request is for 3.00 FTE Investigators and the associated operating costs. The use of force, homicides, officer-involved shootings, and cold case requests is ever increasing. The Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) has been in the unfortunate position to decline cases over the years due to workload outpacing staff resources. Adding three FTE would improve service and responsiveness, allowing DCI to work the full array of crimes against persons and property. Additionally, DCI is establishing at least one Regional Critical Incident Response Team. This will increase requests for assistance requiring management of the callouts. This request is contingent on passage of legislation.



DCI Major Case Section declined 12 requests for investigation in 2022 due to unavailable staff resources.
