On April 24, 2023, they completed their review and began confirming address information for potentially impacted individuals. The type of information identified included name and the following: date of birth, Social Security number, passport number, driver's license/state ID number, financial account number, health insurance information, and medical information. Lincoln Wood identified approximately 2,238 individuals who may have been impacted by this incident.

In response to this incident, Lincoln Wood conducted an investigation, notified the FBI, changed network passwords, and reviewed its policies and procedures related to data protection. Additionally, they provided notice to the potentially impacted individuals on May 11, 2023 via U.S. mail. A copy of the notice is attached as ***Exhibit A***. In an abundance of caution, Lincoln Wood is offering the potentially impacted individuals complimentary credit monitoring and identity protection services.



The credit freeze is designed to prevent credit, loans, and services from being approved in your name without your consent. However, you should be aware that using a credit freeze may delay, interfere with, or prohibit the timely approval of any subsequent request or application you make regarding a new loan, credit, mortgage, or any other account involving the extension of credit. Pursuant to federal law, you cannot be charged to place or lift a credit freeze on your credit report. To request a credit freeze, you will need to provide the following information:

1. Full name (including middle initial as well as Jr., Sr., III, etc.);
2. Social Security number;
3. Date of birth;
4. Address for the prior two to five years;
5. Proof of current address, such as a current utility or telephone bill;
6. A legible photocopy of a government-issued identification card (e.g., state driver's license or identification card); and
7. A copy of either the police report, investigative report, or complaint to a law enforcement agency concerning identity theft, if you are a victim of identity theft.
