### How to play:

The winner is determined by matching the randomly assigned number to the sum of the only or final digit of the two teams’ **final scores**.

For example: If the final score is 28-21, the participant randomly assigned the number “9” is the winner. If the score is 7-3, the number “0” is the winning number.

- Must be 18 years of age to participate.
- No names or initials may appear on the board until payment is made.
- Payment must be in **cash**. No credit allowed.
- All spaces must be sold before randomly assigning numbers 0-9 to right column.
- All unsold spaces must be purchased by the sponsor and marked accordingly.
- The winner must be clearly identified on the board and their name listed on the back.
- Sports pool cards must be retained by sponsor for at least 90 days from date of the event.
- See back for additional rules.

## **ADDITIONAL SPORTS POOL RULES**

**Before you start**, include the applicable information on the sports pool card:

1. Name of the **sponsor** conducting the sports pool (e.g., Bob's Casino). Note: The sponsor must be a licensed gambling operator.
2. The name of the **sports event**.
3. The name of the **competitors** either in the sports event. (ie: Detroit vs. Minnesota).
4. The **date** of the sports event.
5. Total number of **chances** available. (10 spaces)
6. The **cost** to participate for each chance (space) per sports event. (Cost or "price" can be unlimited and all spaces must be sold for the same amount.)
7. The total amount to be **paid** to the winner and/or what prize the winner will receive.

Once you **start selling spaces**, you may not cancel or alter the board in any manner. The board will need to include:

8. Name (or initials) of **participants** who purchased chances on the board. (Space must be paid for before a participant's name or initials are allowed on the board.)
9. **ALL SPACES must be sold to participants and any remaining spaces** prior to start of the game (event) **are considered purchased by the board sponsor**. Those spaces must clearly show they were bought by the sponsor.
10. All money must be maintained separately for each board

When **all spaces are sold**, don't forget:

11. **NUMBERS** will need to be randomly chosen and placed on the board before start of game.
12. **If the sports event is cancelled**, the board sponsor must refund the full amount of the purchase price to each participant. **If the event is rescheduled**, the board sponsor has two options: a) return money back to participants or b) change the board to reflect the new date of the sports event.
13. **Boards that do not sell all their spaces cannot be changed to a new date or sports event. Those spaces have to be purchased by the sponsor prior to the advertised sports event.**

**After the Sports Event:**

14. The **WINNER** of the prize must be identified on the board.
15. **All sports pool cards must be kept for 90 days minimum** after the event.

**\*\*\*NEW\*\*\*** As of 10/1/19, only licensed Gambling Operators can conduct public sports pool boards. Licensed Gambling Operators are now allowed to donate up to 50% of a sports pool board to a qualified nonprofit organization.
