The recent passage of HB 21, which established "Hanna's Act," and SB 312, which created the Looping In Native Communities Network (LINC) Act, changes the ways missing persons cases will be reported and investigated across the state. - ◆ *Training tracks for law enforcement and the public, will include presentations by National AMBER Alert Staff, NCIC, NCMEC, NamUs, FBI, BIA, Montana DOJ, Ryan United*
- ◆ *Topics to include: AMBER Alerts in Indian Country, how, when, and where to file a missing person's report; resources available to the public and law enforcement; nexus of human trafficking and missing persons and runaways, victim awareness and support.*
