Biology

Biological samples need to be dried and packaged in paper or cardboard. Packaging wet items in plastic can lead to mold growth and decreased DNA recovery or render the item unsuitable for analysis.

Please remember that all submissions to the Biology section require a police report. We cannot begin analysis of a case without it.

Chemistry

Please submit a police report with all GSR evidence.

Evidence

Please make sure to properly seal evidence. This includes the plastic ends of syringe tubes and heat seals. All seals that are not manufacturer's seals require an additional seal with the individual's initials or badge number and date sealed.

Latent Prints

Due to some upcoming extended stall leave, some agencies may be contacting regarding a small-scale, short-term outsourcing effort at the start of next year. Overall operations should only be minimally impacted, so please continue to submit cases as normal.

Breath Test Specialist recertifications are now <u>overdue</u>. If you still have not sent yours in, please do so right away to avoid decertification. Please contact the lab with any questions.

In 2023, the Breath Alcohol Section will be moving to digital storage of all records.

Two additional analysts will be starting in the Toxicology Section over the next several months.

Firearms

The Firearm Section is anticipating the installation of a new bullet recovery tank. Team Fabrication, Inc. is in the process of scheduling the installation in the near future. The new system adds a filtration and pumping system, as well as a bullet recovery wand. It also features an illuminated tank and a full length mechanical lid. The new system facilitates the test firing process, greatly improving upon the old system.
