## ALLOWABLE EXPENDITURES

### Planning, Training and Exercise-related costs

- Design, develop, and conduct trainings and exercises.
- Fund travel (e.g., airfare, mileage, per diem and hotel) necessary to complete the project.

### Equipment including Communications Equipment

- Allowable equipment categories and equipment standards can be found on the DHS Authorized Equipment List (<https://www.fema.gov/grants/guidance-tools/authorized-equipment-list>)
- Must meet all regulatory and/or DHS adopted standards
  - Communications equipment must comply with SAFECOM Guidance for Emergency Communications Grants, including provisions on technical standards that ensure and enhance interoperable communications
  - Radios are allowable under the SHSP program but are not a priority project. The Senior Advisory Committee (SAC) may move radio projects to the bottom of the list when reviewing and prioritizing SHSP applications.

### Organization costs

- Personnel costs are permitted under the grant to perform allowable SHSP planning, training, and exercise activities.
  - Funds may not be used for the purpose of fulfilling traditional public safety duties or to supplant traditional public safety positions and responsibilities

### China made or affiliated telecommunication equipment/services are not allowable



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- FEMA funds to procure or obtain China made or China affiliated telecommunication, video surveillance equipment or services. Please reference the System for Award Management (SAM) for a consolidated exclusion list of subsidiaries of telecommunication companies <https://sam.gov/SAM/> or reach out to your Grant Coordinator for guidance.

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- **Application period is typically open from January to March**
- No Cost Share
- Projects must be reviewed and prioritized by the Local Emergency Planning Committee
- Application period is open from January to March
