

# **Sweepstakes**

"Congratulations, You have won \$100,000! You are hereby notified that you are a winner..."

We all dream about winning big and how we would spend the winnings. Sweepstakes scams thrive because they make you believe your dreams might have come true.

## Remember these tips:

- Don't be fooled by official-looking mail. It's not legitimate just because the envelope is marked "urgent" and the contents look impressive.
- Don't give out personal information. No legitimate company will ever need your Social Security, bank account or credit card numbers to declare you a winner.
- Don't pay to win. Buying goods or services won't increase your chances of winning, and you cannot be required to buy something before you collect a prize.
- Don't send money for taxes. If you win a prize, you will never pay taxes directly to the sweepstakes company. Only the government collects taxes.

Remember, prizes are always free.

# Foreign Lotteries

These are always scams. Scam operators use the telephone, mail and e-mail to entice U.S. consumers to buy chances at high-stakes foreign lotteries in countries around the world.

#### Remember:

- You cannot win a lottery when you have not bought a ticket.
- It is illegal to play a lottery in another country from the United States.
- Legitimate lotteries only sell their lottery products within their own areas—
   Montana businesses can only sell Montana lottery tickets.

# Legitimate Lotteries

### A legitimate lottery will:

- never send money orders or cashiers' checks and ask the winner to wire some of the money back
- never require:
- shipping and handling fees
- up-front, cash payment of taxes
- a "good faith" showing—they won't ask you to send money up front to confirm your identity
